COUNTY OFFERS VARIOUS LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES TO EMPLOYEES



A few years ago, Randolph County administrators recognized the need for a county-wide leadership development program after investing in leaders through NACo (National Association of Counties). Additionally, after surveying employees, results confirmed that respondents ranked Supportive Leadership as the third most desired attribute of an employer.

In April 2023, Randolph County implemented a Leadership Academy program (RCLA) that county employees submitted applications to attend. A total of 13 employees enrolled in the first year-long program to engage in leadership development. [You may access the full story here.](#)

RANDOLPH COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FUND NONPROFIT GRANTS

The Randolph County Board of Commissioners voted to invest \$987,887.10 to fund grant requests from 13 local nonprofits and municipalities. In 2017, the commissioners at that time elected to make funding from the payments from Waste Management available for organizations seeking to advance projects that would improve the Public Health, Public Safety, or Wellbeing of residents through grants, the three priority areas in the Strategic Plan.
