## LOCAL COMMITTEE OF AMERICA 250 NC RELEASE "REVOLUTIONARY RANDOLPH" LOGO



Mac Whatley, Chairman of the County's America 250 NC Committee, presented the logo of **Revolutionary Randolph** at the most recent county commissioners meeting. The logo, designed by Richard Schoenberger of Manor House Creative, depicts local history in many ways.

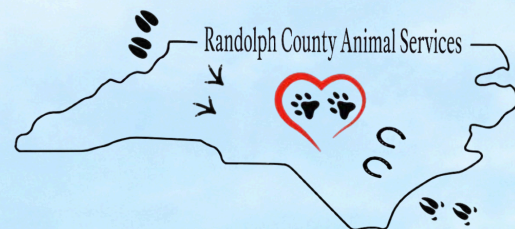
The horseman figure is a representation of a stove tile unearthed during an archaeological dig in 1974-1975 at the Jacob Meyer pottery site on Mount Shepherd in western Randolph County. One of the first known potters, Meyer was a Moravian master potter active in the late 1700s. The tile is referred to as "The Dragoon," and was found with another referred to as "The Minuteman." The figures in both tile images have the characteristics of Continental soldiers. The logo contains 13 eight-pointed stars, which were often used on unofficial flags during the war, including the Battle of Guilford Courthouse. The committee has been working on many initiatives and events to celebrate the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of America next year as well as Randolph County's 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2029.
