

**Annual Financial Report on Fees from Building Inspections Program
 Randolph County
 Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2025**

Permits for building, electrical, mechanical and plumbing work are issued and inspections are made at various stages of construction in each trade. State law mandates this process and all work is inspected for compliance with the North Carolina State Building Codes and Randolph County's Unified Development Ordinance. All Inspectors that work for the department are required to be certified by the North Carolina Code Officials Qualification Board and must attend yearly continuing education classes in each trade to maintain their certifications.

For Fiscal Year 2024-2025, Randolph County Building Inspections had sixteen employees that are spread between three service areas; three in Permitting, eleven in Inspections, and two in Plan Review.
