### RANDOLPH COUNTY VISITOR SPENDING STATISTICS FROM 2024



### 2ND ANNUAL SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT

Domestic and international visitors to and within Randolph County spent \$199.86 million in 2024, an increase of 5.4% from \$189.5 million in 2023. This data comes from an annual study commissioned by Visit North Carolina, a unit of the Economic Development Partnership of North Carolina (EDPNC).
