

## **Commissioner Meeting Recap for November 3, 2025**

The November meeting of the Randolph County Board of Commissioners included retirement celebrations, as well as several project and status updates.

A few highlights:

- Recognized Major Jeff Cook, retiring with 28 years of service with the Randolph County Sheriff's Office.
- Recognized Sergeant Tammy Hughes, retiring with 18 years of service with the Randolph County Sheriff's Office.
- Commissioners adopted a Proclamation to commemorate November as National Adoption Month.
- Commissioners adopted a Proclamation to recognize Jerome Davis and his team, Carolina Cowboys won the National PBR 2025 Championship.
- Commissioners adopted a Resolution to recognize Veterans through Operation Green Light at Randolph County buildings (November 4-11).
- Proposed changes to the United Development Ordinance (UDO) in relation to sign regulation updates were discussed and tabled until the January 6, 2026 meeting.
- Superintendent Dr. Stephen Gainey from Randolph County School System requested \$750,000 to be used for Capital Funds; approved
- United Way Director Sam Baker provided community updates.
- Jeff Morse with Charters of Freedom proposal, presented to commissioners the opportunity in Randolph County to display our national foundational documents.
- Mac Whatley, Chairman of the America 250 NC Randolph County Committee, presented the current activities of the committee including website, projects, and events.
- Register of Deeds Krista Lowe requested staff position reclassifications; approved
- Lt. Col. Steven Nunn with Randolph County Sheriff Office requested holiday pay policy change; approved
- Randolph County Animal Services Director Jonathan Moody requested animal nuisance policy change; approved

- Deputy Chief Jared Byrd with Randolph County Emergency Services requested Viper Tower equipment to be installed in the Staley area as budgeted; approved
- Tracie Murphy, Director of Randolph County Department of Social Services and Tara Aker, Public Health Director gave updates on the status of programs affected by the federal government shutdown and an unadopted state budget.
- The Annual Meeting of the Board of Commissioners and Asheboro City Schools was set for February 12, 2026.
